Lesson #4 - Father Abraham & Mother Sarah

Dear Families, I am very excited to hear about the hits we are receiving on our online lessons. I pray you are all enjoying the singing, the art and the stories. I am enjoying sharing them with you. I wanted to let you know about some other resources available to you. First, I looked online and found a few sites that sell Bible Picture stickers. Many children love stickers. I still would like them to do a lot of drawing themselves. Children reach a point where they don't like their drawing because they cannot make it look like what they see. This usually occurs around 10-12 years old. Before that they have built a schema of symbols for certain things: circle for a person (2-3 yrs); a triangle on top of a square for a house (4-6 yrs) even in the Southwest where we have so many flat roofs. A cube (6-up) is tricky to draw. The children know a cube has square sides, but one must draw a square, a rectangle and a rhombus for it to look like a cube on paper. These symbols, and many more, are very common throughout many cultures and are a healthy growth for children's art. The more they draw, the better it is for them to develop through the stages. Of course these stages take place at different times in different children. We should not try to get them to draw differently unless they specifically ask for help. This is from our art consultant, Ms. Nancy. She suggested a book on the subject, Drawing on the Right Side of the Brain, by Betty Edwards. I used this book when I taught 5th grade and there was no art instruction in APS. My students really enjoyed the activities even though I am not an artist. P.S. I did not get the Bible animals puzzle in the last download packet, so I am including it in this one.

#### Materials:

## Stick Stars:

- \*thin sticks-either gather some from outside or buy at craft store (in floral arrangement area?)
- \*aluminum foil
- \*hot glue gun and glue sticks
- \*glitter glue or Elmer's glue and loose glitter (good project for outside if you use this)
- \*clear fishing line

#### Instructions:

- 1. Cut or break sticks into 5 equal pieces.
- 2. Plug in the glue gun to warm up hot glue while you assemble star.
- 3. Tear a piece of aluminum foil about 8" long. Place the foil on a flat surface and lay out a 5 point star by over lapping the sticks so the ends of the sticks touch and form points.
- 4. An adult needs to do this next step! Carefully put small globs of hot glue at the points of star. Make sure the ends are touching. But, keep your fingertips away from the hot glue! You can add a second set of sticks on top of the first 5 sticks by gluing them at the same 5 points.
- 5. Once the hot flue has set up, carefully lift the star off the foil. If any of the end points need more glue, carefully apply it while you hold the star.
- 6. Put the stick star back on the foil and paint both sides with glitter glue or with Elmer's then sprinkle with glitter.
- 7. After drying, cut an 8" or longer piece of fishing line. Put through one point and double knot it.

# Foil Stars:

- \*star patterns from downloads or draw your own star
- \*thin cardboard (ie: from a graham cracker box or other thin box)
- \*string or yarn
- \*aluminum foil
- \*permanent magic markers in various colors
- \*Elmer's glue

#### Instructions:

- 1. Cut a star or more than one, out of the thin cardboard and prepare a place to work by putting down paper that can be thrown away later.
- 2. On a piece of newspaper or other disposable paper, squeeze a daub of glue onto the paper.
- 3. Cut string into about 6 different length pieces. Lay the pieces on the star so that the strings connect in different places making divisions on the star. Let dry. Cover the star with a small piece of foil that is just bigger than the star. Use fingers (no finger nails) to push the foil down in between the string pieces. Fold the foil around the star. You will need to cut the foil from the outside into the inner corners.
- 4. Tape the foil down out the back.
- 5. Color in the shapes formed by the string pieces with permanent magic marker. **Be careful because** this marker will not come out of your clothes or off the surface on which you are using it.
- 6. If you want to do the same to the back, you will need to cut a star shaped piece of foil, repeat number six and glue the star foil to the back.
- 7. If you want to hang it up punch a hole in one point and use yarn, fishing line or string. Cut an 8" or longer piece of string and put it through the hole. Tie string ends by holding both together into a double knot.

# Stars in the Sky:

- \*black paper, ie: construction paper or a piece of paper painted black
- \*star stickers (can be found in the grocery sometimes, as well as, construction paper)
- \*metallic gel pens in gold and sliver

#### Instructions:

- 1. Place star stickers randomly on the black paper.
- 2. Use gel pens to draw various sizes of stars. Color them in so they show up well.
- 3. Use gel pens to draw stars with criss crossing lines.
- 4. Use gel pens to make many small dots all over the black paper to give the idea of the many millions of star far away in the distance.
- \*\*I will show the finished products at the end of the video in case our instructions were not clear enough. There are also some instructions and pictures next to the larger star patterns that just require paper.

### **Science/Social Studies Connections:**

- -Study online or in books about stars.
- -Study about travel in Bible times. Write about a time when you traveled and compare the two.


