#54- PreK-2nd: God's Promise to Noah, 3rd and up: God's Promise to Abram & Sarai

Dear Families: Today we are looking at two of God's promises. We will finish up the Noah story with the younger children and continue Abram and Sarai's story with the older ones. Promises from God are always fulfilled, but not always in the way we expect. "Be still and know that I am God," from Psalm 46:10 is interpreted in different ways. In the context of the rest of the Psalm, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change. . ." reminds me that even though the world may be falling apart around me, God reigns over my life and God's power will protect and keep me. God will keep the promises God makes to us. God Bless.

Bible Texts:

PreK-2nd: Genesis 8:1-17 Abridged

"But God remembered Noah and all the animals. . .that were with him in the ark. And God made a wind to blow over the earth, and the waters subsided. . .and the waters gradually receded from the earth. . .And Noah sent out a dove to see if the waters had subsided. . .but the dove found no place to rest its foot and returned to him in the ark. . .(Noah waited and sent it out again, this time returning with an olive leaf in its beak). . .(Noah sent the dove out again and this time it did not return.) Then God said, 'Go out of the ark, you and your wife and your sons and your son's wives (and all the animals.') Then Noah built an altar to the Lord. . .Then God said. . .I establish My covenant (promise) with you that never again. . .shall there be a flood to destroy the earth. . .I have set My bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the covenant between Me and the earth."

3rd and Up: Genesis 15:1-6; Genesis 17:1-6; Genesis 21:1-7 Abridged

". . .the Word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, 'Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield. Your reward shall be very great.' But Abram said, 'O Lord God, what will You give me, for I continue childless. . . ' And Abram said, 'You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir.' But the word of the Lord came to him, 'This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be you heir.' He brought him outside and said, 'Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then God said to him, 'So shall you descendants be.' And Abram believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness. When Abram, was ninetynine years old, the Lord appeared to Abram, and said to him, 'I and God almighty, walk before Me and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between Me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous.' Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, 'As for Me, this is My covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham. For I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. . . God said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife. . . Sarah shall be her name. I will bless her and she shall give rise to nations. Kings of peoples shall come from her. . .your wife Sarah shall bear you a son, and you shall name him Isaac. . . The Lord dealt with Sarah as He had said, and the Lord did for Sarah as He had promised. Sarah conceived and bore Abraham a son in his old age, at the time at which God had spoken to him. Abraham gave the name Isaac to his son whom Sarah bore him. . . Abraham was a hundred years old when his son Isaac was born to him. Now Sarah said said, 'God has brought laughter for me; everyone who hears will laugh with me.' And she said, 'Who would ever have said to Abraham that Sarah would nurse children? Yet I have borne him a son in his old age."

Memorization:

Have children make a bookmark using the pinkie swear picture or the rainbow with clouds picture. Cut out a strip of heavy paper about 2 inches by 7 inches. Have child color and cut out the picture of their choice and glue it to the top of the strip. Or they could draw a picture of their own that reminds them of the words from the verse. The child can write the verse longways on the strip or cut out the printed verse above and paste it on. Have your child read it several times.





Old Noah Built An Ark Rhythm Page

One heart equals one beat. One ark equals one sound on the beat. Two arks equal two sounds on the beat. Draw note stems under the words to show rhythm. | equals one sound on the beat and | equals two sounds on the beat. Enlist help from another person: one plays the steady beat (one hit per each heart,) and the other plays the rhythm (one hit per each ark.) Notice the rhythm matches the parts of the words.

As Numerous as the Stars (based on Genesis 12:1-8, 15:3-6, 21:1-5)

The Bible tells us that a man named Abraham loved God very much. One day God spoke to him. "Abraham, I want you and your family to move. I will show you where I want you to live."

Abraham trusted God. He packed up his family, and they started the long journey. God was pleased. One day, as they were traveling, God made a promise to Abraham. "I will make your people a great people, Abraham. I will bless you and make your name great. Everyone here on earth will be blessed because of you."

What a promise! On the way, they stopped at a place called Moreh. Again, God spoke to Abraham: "Abraham, I will give all this land to your children." In honor of God's promise,

Abraham made an altar and worshiped God.


Abraham wondered how this land could belong to his children when he did not have any children. He was old, and his wife, Sarah, was old.

Abraham and his family finally came to Canaan, the land where God wanted them to live. Again, God spoke to Abraham: "Look up, Abraham. See all the stars in the sky?"


