# ACOMA BUSINESS ENTERPRISES WILL BE HONORED WITH A GOLD AWARD

## IN 51<sup>st</sup> HSMAI ADRIAN AWARDS COMPETITION

# Presentations will be at the 18<sup>th</sup> Annual Gala Dinner Jan. 28 in New York City

#### Acoma Business Enterprises, Sky City Cultural Center

Experience the Living Culture and hospitality of the Acoma Tribe at Acoma Pueblo's Sky City Cultural Center and Haak'u Museum, 45 minutes west of Albuquerque, become immersed in the living culture of the Acoma Tribe. The grand opening of Sky City Cultural Center and Haak'u Museum in 2006 heralded a new era for the tribe, providing an expressive portal to showcase Acoma art, culture and history.

However, visitors have been welcomed to Sky City Pueblo, North America's oldest continually inhabited settlement (1150 A.D.), for almost a century. On a guided walking tour that departs from the Cultural Center, visitors have a unique experience atop the sheer walled 357-foot sandstone bluff. San Esteban del Rey Mission is a tour highlight, one of the largest and oldest Spanish missions in New Mexico.

In 2007, the National Trust for Historic Preservation recognized the Pueblo of Acoma as the 28th National Historic Trust Site, the only Native American community to receive this designation.

Exhibits now at the Haak'u Museum include The Matriarchs, tracing the evolution of celebrated Acoma pottery through four artisans and Pueblo Faces and Places, a photography exhibit by famed photographer and Laguna Tribe Elder Lee Marmon that explores the living culture of New Mexico's Pueblo tribes. Works by tribe artisans can be purchased at the "Gaits'i" (Beautiful) museum gift shop and savor New Mexican as well as Native American cuisine in the "Yaak'a" (Corn) Café.

Complement this experience at nearby Sky City Casino Hotel with four dining options, AAA triple diamond-rated hotel accommodation as well as entertainment opportunities including Las Vegas-style gaming and concerts.
